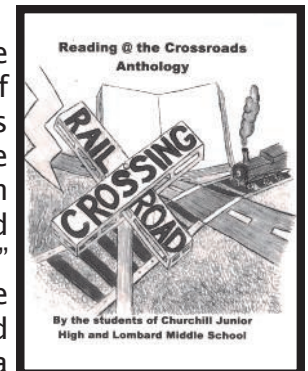

Reading @ the Crossroads II... *The Power of Dreams!*

Some experiences in life you just cannot wait to try again... **Reading @ the Crossroads** is one of them. Two years ago, the Galesburg Public Schools Foundation asked representatives of the middle schools two questions: What do you, as teachers, dream about providing your students? What do your students need?

With well established goals in hand, a steering committee set out to create a yearlong focus on reading and writing across the curriculum. The results exceeded all expectations. Two authors made presentations and inspired the students. The literature of Christopher Paul Curtis & Harriette Gillem Robinet was presented, read, and shared by students, teachers and community members who took their time to read and discuss the books and historical moments woven throughout the text.

This highly successful program involved the entire community and spoke volumes about the value of literacy. The Galesburg Register Mail ran stories of Galesburg's history relevant to the times in the books read & students expressed themselves in many different medias. They wrote and recorded ads for the radio; published their own "Kids Page" in the newspaper; read poetry at a local coffee shop; made collages, pencil drawings and board games. In the end, their works were judged and a 56 page Anthology was published with the works of 117 students.

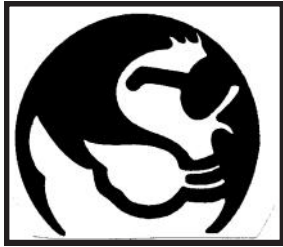
Memorials...

Our little duck canisters were also seen around town at various restaurants asking to be fed with your spare change. We want to thank our **Quacker Backers** and **prize donors** who continue to make the race successful and a fun and enjoyable time for all.

This years Grand Prize winner, **Crop Production**, donated back their cash winnings to the Foundation! We would like to thank them for their generosity in donating this \$2,000 back to the Foundation (see photo).

The hard work of our volunteers helped the Foundation raise over **\$20,000** that will go right back to our schools. With the profits of the duck race, the foundation board sets an amount per student to be given back to the schools each year. As of this printing, we have approved several requests. **Gale School** is using their money for a visiting author who will help promote reading; a performance of a local jazz sextet for the music program along with three novel sets for the 3rd grade classes. **Churchill** has been awarded funds for two nationally known speakers, Greg Forbes Siegman and Carl Cannon. Both men inform the students of the importance of tolerance for others, making good choices and staying in school. **Silas Willard** and **King Schools** will also be using their duck dollars for visiting authors, with King also adding a Pioneer Living Exhibit. **Steele School** is purchasing software that addresses phonics, reading, and early keyboarding, primarily for their Kindergarten through 2nd graders.
